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Invitation to bid Federal Treasury discount paper (Bubills)

As already announced the following Bubills will be reopened or newly issued by a multi-ISIN auction on 30 January 2023:

Reopening

Federal Treasury discount paper (Bubills)

June 2022 issue / maturity 12 months

ISIN DE0001030856

Current volume: € 10.5 billion

Due on 21 June 2023

Residual maturity: 5 months (140 interest days)

New issue

Federal Treasury discount paper (Bubills)

January 2023 issue / maturity 11 months

ISIN DE000BU0E006

Due on 12 December 2023 (315 interest days)

A total amount of € 5 billion is envisaged for the reopened and newly issued Bubill (including respective retention quote) with a planned share of € 2 billion for the Bubill June 2022 issue (ISIN DE0001030856) and € 3 billion for the Bubill January 2023 issue (ISIN DE000BU0E006). The effective increase or new issue amount of each Bubill will be determined by the allotment on 30 January 2023.

Members of the Bund Issues Auction Group are entitled to bid. Bids must be for a par value of not less than € 1 million or an integral multiple thereof. The price bids must be expressed as full 0.00005 percentage points. It is possible to make non-competitive bids and to submit several bids at different prices. No yield bids will be considered. The bids accepted by the issuer will be allotted at the price specified in the bid. Non-competitive bids are filled at the weighted average price of the price bids accepted. The right to scale down bids is reserved.

Time schedule of the auction procedure:

Bidding period: Monday, 30 January 2023, from 8.00 a.m. until 11.30 a.m. Frankfurt time

Value date: Wednesday, 1 February 2023

Settlement: delivery versus payment-settlement in the night-time processing of Clearstream Banking AG Frankfurt, beginning on the eve of the value date

In addition, the Auction rules, the Special terms and conditions of the Deutsche Bundesbank for auctions of Federal securities using the Bund Bidding System (BBS) and the Issue terms for Federal securities shall apply.
