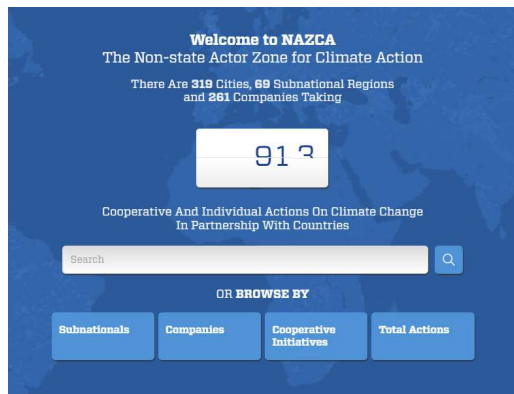

Global Climate Action portal: COP references

Session	Decision	Text
COP 20 - Lima	1/CP. 20, para 21	Welcomes the Lima Climate Action High-level Meeting convened by the President of the Conference of the Parties on 11 December 2014 and encourages the Executive Secretary and the President of the Conference of the Parties to convene an annual high-level event on enhancing implementation of climate action;
COP 21 - Paris	1/CP.21, para 117	Welcomes the efforts of non-Party stakeholders to scale up their climate actions, and encourages the registration of those actions in the Non-State Actor Zone for Climate Action platform
	1/CP.21, para 134	Invites the non-Party stakeholders referred to in paragraph 133 above to scale up their efforts and support actions to reduce emissions and/or to build resilience and decrease vulnerability to the adverse effects of climate change and demonstrate these efforts via the Non-State Actor Zone for Climate Action platform referred to in paragraph 117 above;
COP 25 - Madrid	1/CP.25, para 29	Also requests the secretariat to continue engaging with non-Party stakeholders and enhancing the effectiveness of the Non-State Actor Zone for Climate Action platform, including the tracking of voluntary action;
COP 26 - Glasgow	1/CP. 26, para 56	Welcomes the improvement of the Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action for enhancing ambition, the leadership and actions of the high-level champions, and the work of the secretariat on the Non-State Actor Zone for Climate Action platform to support accountability and track progress of voluntary initiatives;
COP 27 - Sharm	1/CP.27, para 65	Invites the secretariat to ensure greater accountability of voluntary initiatives through the Non-State Actor Zone for Climate Action platform

Global Climate Action portal: Genesis



- Non-state Actor Zone for Climate Action (NAZCA) launched at COP20 in Lima
- Objective to demonstrate groundswell of climate action undertaken by non-Party stakeholders
- Encourage national governments to increase their ambition going into COP21
- Recognized in the cover decision to the Paris Agreement with call for non-Party stakeholders to register their actions on NAZCA

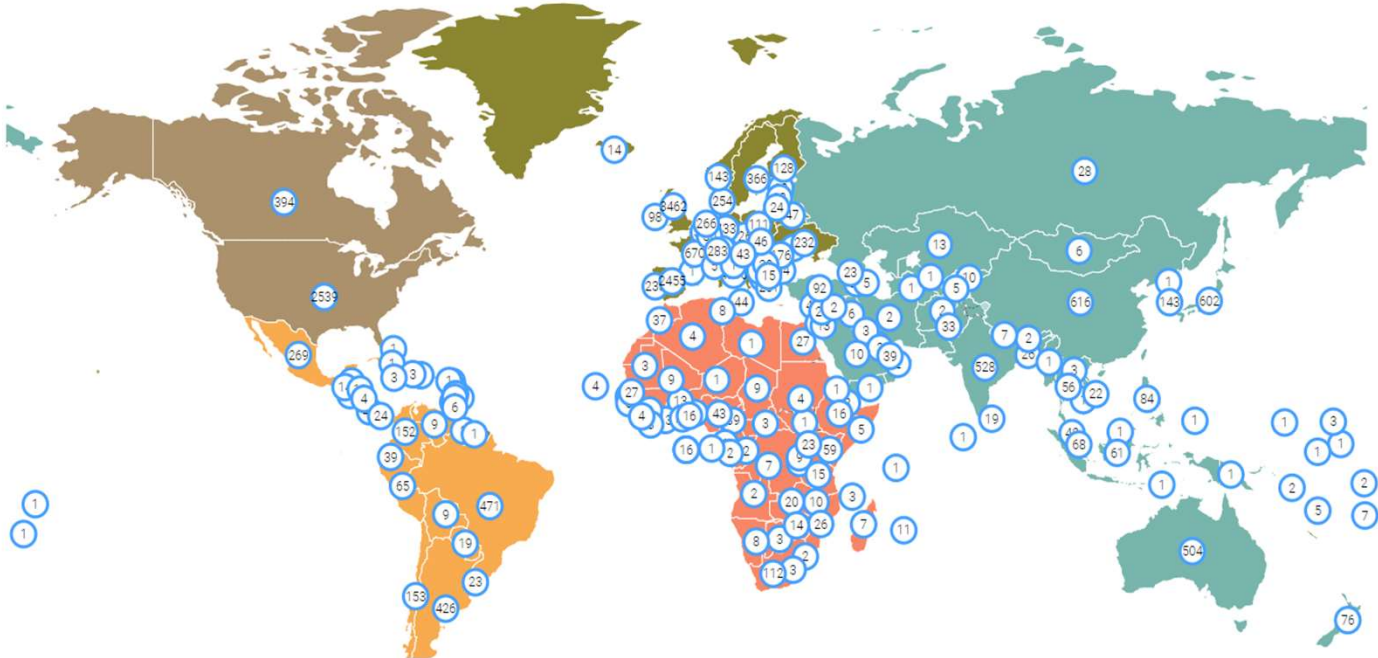

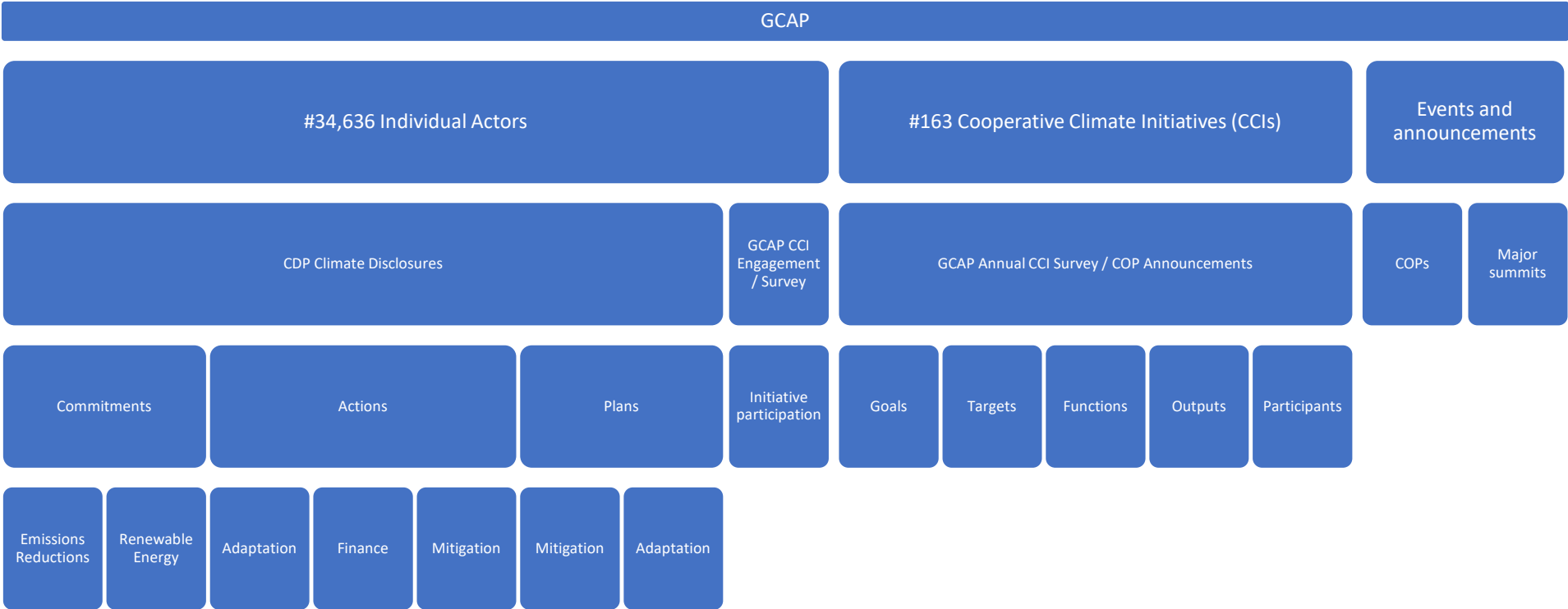

Cooperative climate initiative tracking

Cooperative climate initiatives (CCIs) are coordinated efforts involving multiple stakeholders, such as non-state and subnational actors and/or national governments collaborating to achieve a clearly stated climate goal. Non-state and subnational actors include cities, regions, businesses, investors, and other organizations such as academic institutions and research bodies. These actors may act as secretariats or lead organizations for an initiative or participants committed to the initiative's goal.

Cooperative climate initiatives may focus on climate mitigation (directly or indirectly reducing greenhouse gases), climate adaptation and resilience (directly or indirectly fostering adaptation to the impacts of climate change) or a mix of both. Efforts take the form of forging coalitions, alliances, and networks; developing declarative platforms, hubs or innovative solutions; producing and disseminating knowledge through publications and physical events; setting norms and standards; implementing local projects; establishing monitoring arrangements; training and building capacity; running awareness campaigns; lobbying governments; and creating new products or services.

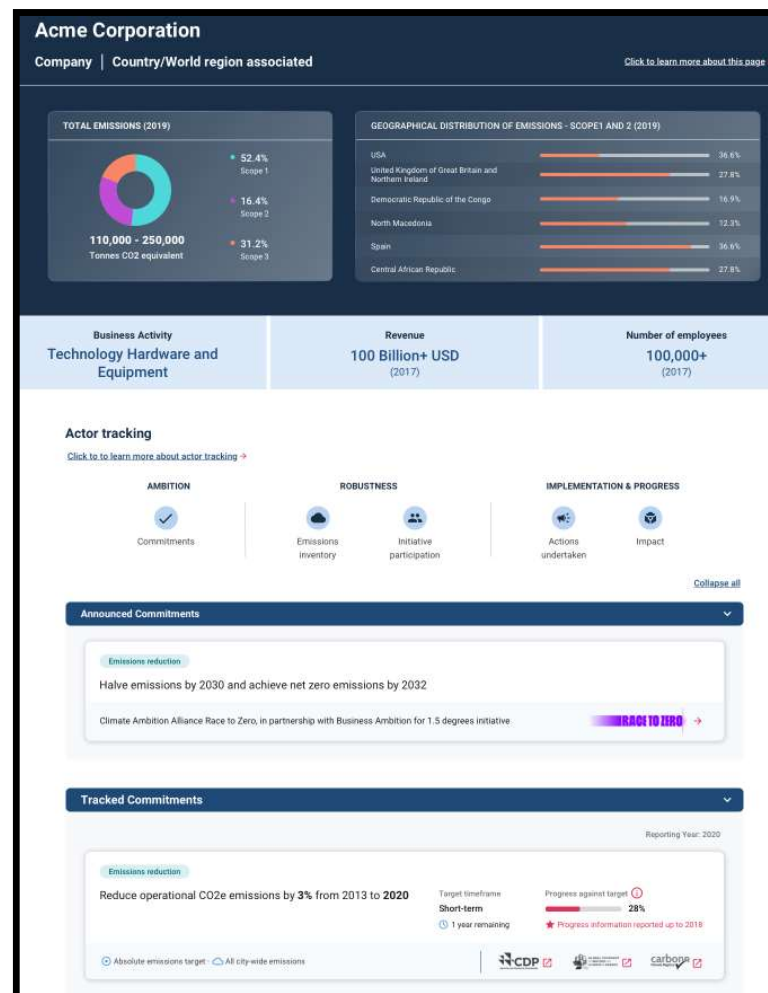
Progress tracking

At COP26 in November 2021 the Global Climate Action portal launched the tracking of voluntary climate action with the inclusion of a progress reporting framework for cooperative initiatives registered in the portal. Through an annual survey, registered initiatives are asked to provide updates and report progress information. Initiatives participating in the survey in 2021, 2022, 2023 are considered active and can be identified in the list below as having a magenta font – using the Status filter these can be isolated from initiatives that have concluded or whose status is unknown.

Please note: The information presented here is based on 'as-reported' contributions provided by the initiatives and data partners and does not necessarily reflect views or bear the endorsement of the UNFCCC Secretariat.

Taking place between 30th November and 12th December 2023 in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, the 28th Conference of the Parties (COP28) brings together world leaders, negotiators, observer organizations and stakeholders from around the world to discuss and agree on ways to address the climate crisis.

Announcement Tracking

COP provides an important opportunity to announce commitments and launch initiatives that can have a significant impact on the trajectory of global greenhouse gas emissions and environmental sustainability, if followed up and fully implemented.

The Global Climate Action Portal (GCAP) is tracking COP28 climate action announcements – including those associated with the programmes of the COP28 Presidency, the High-Level Champions and the Marrakech Partnership. You can also notify us of your COP28 announcements using this [Form](#).

As well as providing a publicly accessible repository of climate action announcements made during the conference, GCAP also provides a basis to track their progress, including through their integration with the Portal's actor tracking and initiative tracking components.

The information, which is updated throughout the conference, can be navigated using a search function and filters: the Thematic filter is based on the COP28 Thematic programme, whilst the Focus filter provides a way of identifying announcements by their climate focus area: adaptation and resilience, mitigation and means of implementation.
